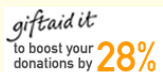

# Suubi Trust

Suubi Trust was established in 2007 to help support the work of International Medical Foundation (IMF) in Uganda.

Dr. Ian Clarke started IMF more than 20 years ago, providing medical care and treatment for the most vulnerable in Ugandan society.

## Northern Uganda

Suubi Trust funds the provision of **primary healthcare** to those living in Northern Uganda, at clinics in **Lira** and **Pader**. Without such intervention those being treated would either be unable to find the care needed or simply not be able to afford the fees usually charged. In Uganda there is no NHS providing care free of charge. Conditions being treated include malaria, typhoid, diarrhoea and respiratory infections.

Some communities are in very remote areas and the sick cannot always travel to our clinics. So we are piloting **mobile clinics** taking care and treatment to those that need it most. We are seeking corporate sponsors for this initiative.

At the end of last year Suubi Trust met the cost for staff to receive training and accreditation by the District. Kenneth, a Clinical Officer at the Lira clinic, is now able to deliver regular **immunization programmes**, the drugs for which are supplied by the Government.

## Hope Ward

There are times when patients need more **intensive medical care** and for this there is **Hope Ward** at International Hospital Kampala. This hospital, dedicated to excellence in medical care, offers its Hope Ward facilities to needy patients free of charge. Suubi Trust is one of the sponsors helping to meet these costs.

Earlier this year one of our volunteers in Lira met Dennis, a 7 year old with a large cancerous tumour on the side of his face. Dennis was unable to get adequate treatment in Lira and so was admitted to Hope Ward. There he received **surgery** and **chemotherapy** and is now on the road to recovery.

## HIV/AIDS Outreach Programmes

Everyone agrees that prevention is better than cure. However the reality is that many living in Uganda are not aware of the ways in which HIV is spread or how it can be treated. The number of people living with HIV/AIDS is on the increase.

Suubi Trust is helping to meet the cost of facilities and staff who go into communities, providing education, counselling, testing and treatment.

## Costs

All money received by Suubi Trust is used to support the work in Uganda. We make no deductions either from your contributions or from tax relief claimed through Gift Aid.

Our trustees are volunteers who do not charge for their time, or claim any payment or expenses. We have no administration costs.

Operational costs for Hope Ward and the charity clinics are subsidized by Dr. Clarke. Suubi Trust does not pay rent or contribute to the capital costs of establishing this required infrastructure.

### **A small donation can go a long way...**

What can you get with £8.50? In the UK it might get you a very small round of drinks, or a couple of cinema tickets, or a rather forgettable meal.

**£8.50** will meet the average cost of basic treatment at our clinics in Lira and Pader.

**£20** per month will provide physiotherapy treatment on a weekly basis for those with long term rehabilitation needs.

**£100** provides the required chemotherapy to treat cervical cancer and **£300** will provide the life changing drugs and surgery used to treat breast cancer.
